Following a dramatic conversion at the age of 19 as an art student, I have been a Christian for 35 years, beginning within the independent charismatic King's Church network in the South East of England and latterly moving more within classical Pentecostal circles. Together with my family, I have been an active member of the Eagle's Nest Church in Nottingham for 16 years. This church is a member of the Assemblies of God denomination.

I am currently completing the third of three books on the atonement from the viewpoints first of tradition (*Atonement Theories*, 2014), then of experience (*The Old Rugged Cross*, 2016) and now of Scripture: *Pictures of Atonement: A New Testament Study*).
- 14 years of experience in academic leadership, having designed, taught and assessed modules at undergraduate and MA level, and having designed an entire BA by distance learning approved by Chester University, and having been a programme leader of both PGT and PGR programmes.

#### Employment

**Sep 2012 – present: Lecturer in Theology,** Cliff College, a Partner College of the University of Manchester.

I teach on the full range of programmes at Cliff College: short courses, the BA in Theology and Mission, the MA in Theology and Mission, and have so far supervised nine research students to completion. I am the module leader for 'Christian Theology in Outline, 'Christian Spirituality,' 'Philosophy,' and 'Discipleship and Discipling' at undergraduate level, and 'Christian Doctrine and Mission' on the MA. In May 2018 I became the founder and director of the Samuel Chadwick Centre, convening its first annual lecture in October 2018, and between May 2019 and January 2024 I took on the role of Postgraduate Research Programme Lead, which involved the oversight of two doctoral programmes: a standard PhD and a professional doctorate, the PhD Missiology. I convened the residential teaching weeks for this as well as chairing the Research Degrees Committee and taking the lead in the annual enhancement cycle in dialogue with the University of Manchester.

# **May 2010 – August 2012: Director of Graduate Studies,** *Mattersey Hall College, validated by Chester University.*

This was a promotion, having been acting Director since January 2010. Responsibilities included providing academic and pastoral support to MA and DMin students, liaising with the validating university, module and curriculum development, and coordinating and delivering the formative and summative assessment of very large amounts of coursework. I played a leading role at exam boards, wrote the Annual Monitoring Reviews and steered the Graduate School through two validation processes in as many years (Glyndwr and Chester). Throughout these processes I nurtured a healthy annual intake of students that maintained Mattersey Hall Graduate School as one of the largest theological graduate schools in Europe. I also designed a BA by distance learning for approval by Chester University. I line managed three members of staff. The teaching load, however, was too light, prompting my application for the lecturing post at Cliff College. I taught two MA modules: Pentecostal Church History and Contemporary Issues in Atonement Theology.

# August 2009 – May 2010: Graduate School Registrar, Mattersey Hall College, validated by the University of Bangor.

I coordinated all aspects of recruitment, admissions, and student support for Mattersey's graduate programmes as well as its distance learning BTh course. I also marked a considerable amount of work at all levels, gave tutorial supervision to the full time MA students and to a number of distance learning students.

**February 2008 – July 2009: Customer Service Administrator**, *Welcome Financial Services*, Nottingham.

Here, while I finished my PhD, and by now also supporting a young family, I worked as part of a team of young people, delivering administrative products and services.

#### **September 2005- July 2008: Self-Employed Lecturer in Theology & Church History,** *Manchester Christian College, Birmingham Cosmopolitan College and Birmingham Christian College.*

During the earlier stages of my PhD, I was self-employed as a visiting lecturer at some smaller institutions, teaching and assessing a considerable range of topics but maintaining systematic and historical theology as my central teaching interests. The teaching carried out at Manchester Christian College was part of a University of London Bachelor of Divinity,

taught by extension, and the teaching at Birmingham Christian College was under University of Wales validation at that time.

July 2003- July 2005: Visiting Lecturer in Church History *Filadelfia Bible College*, Udaipur, India.

This college is home to the Native Missionary Movement. Here, over three successive summer vacations, I prepared students for an MDiv degree, as well as delivering some undergraduate teaching, all accredited by the Asia Theological Association. The modules I taught were The Kingdom of God, the History of Pentecostal & Charismatic Movements and Church History: Reformation – Present Day.

# **May 1993-March 2005: Army Logistics.** HQ 4<sup>th</sup> Division (Aldershot) & HQ 49 Brigade (Nottingham).

By the time I left Aldershot to marry Pearl, I had been promoted to Air Reservations Manager at HQ 4<sup>th</sup> Division, Aldershot. In this capacity I supervised one member of staff and managed a contract between the MoD and Qatar Airways for the transportation of Ghurkha families to and from Kathmandu. I was privileged to visit Nepal twice at this time.

#### July 1991-January 1993: Self-Employed Artist. Specialism: oil painting.

I was the only graduate of my year at what is now called the University for the Creative Arts who chose to become a full time artist. This was a bold move and was made on the basis that I sold almost all the pieces in my degree show, and, the following month was awarded a commission from Bang and Olufsen to paint some backdrops for an exhibition at Heathrow Airport. In my youthful naiveté I concluded that every month would be like this! I occupied myself doing one-man shows, taking part in some group exhibitions as far afield as Germany and Chelsea, and teaching 7-11 year olds in various extra-curricular art and craft classes, before financial constraints compelled me to close the business and start looking for a job.
